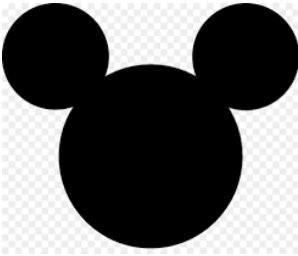

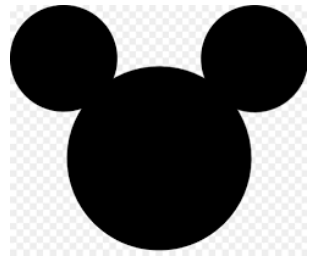

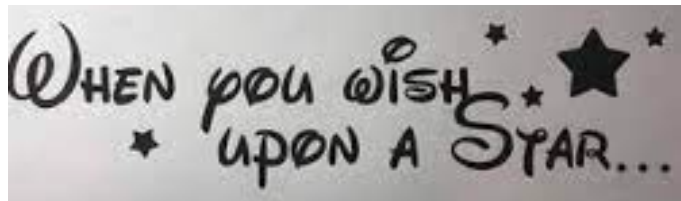

CLASS D1i. Varsity Open Dressage Test:

- Test: IEA Open Rider Test
- Open to riders in grades 9-12 who are not otherwise eligible for the varsity intermediate, or lower divisions.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 12.

To be eligible for post-season competitions in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) open DSE classes.

CLASS D3i. Varsity Intermediate Dressage Test:

- Test: IEA Intermediate Rider Test
- Open to riders in grades 9-12.
- Open to riders who have not competed in a recognized or schooling dressage competition at Second level or higher.
- ~~Riders may not have competed in the FEI 5-year-old test or above.~~
- Riders may not have been rated B or higher by the United States Pony Clubs, Inc.
- Riders who have won ten (10) or more blue ribbons in jumping events at 3'3" (1.0 meter) or higher are not eligible for intermediate classes (Rule G3101).
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 9.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) intermediate or open dressage seat equitation classes.

CLASS D5i. Junior Varsity Novice Dressage Test:

- Test: IEA Novice Rider Test
- Open to riders in grades 9-12.
- Open to riders who have not competed in six (6) or more first level tests or competed at a level higher than first level in any recognized or schooling dressage competition.
- Riders may not have been rated C+, C-3 or higher by the United States Pony Clubs, Inc.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 7.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) novice or intermediate DSE classes.

CLASS D9i. Future Intermediate Dressage Test:

- Test: IEA Intermediate Rider Test
- Open to riders in grades 4-8 who meet the criteria for dressage Class D1- Varsity Open Dressage Test or Class D3- Varsity Intermediate Test.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) novice or intermediate DSE classes.

CLASS D2i. Varsity Open Dressage Seat Equitation (DSE):

- Open to riders in grades 9-12.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 12.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

CLASS D4i. Varsity Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation:

- Open to riders in grades 9-12.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.

- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 6.
- Riders may not cross-enter into Class D8 Walk/Trot.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

CLASS D8i. Junior Varsity Beginner Dressage Seat Equitation - Walk/Trot:

- Open to riders in grades 9-12 who meet criteria for Class D7 but are not yet ready to compete on an unfamiliar horse at a canter.
- To be eligible for Class D8, riders must have at least six (6) months continuous professional instruction, must demonstrate proficiency at a trot, and must be capable of competing on a variety of unfamiliar horses.
- Riders should be capable of performing DSE Tests 1 - 5.
- Individual points will be tracked in Class D8 Walk/Trot for post-season qualification.
- No team points will be awarded in Class D8 Walk/Trot during regular or post-season shows.
- Riders may not cross-enter Class D7 Walk/Trot/Canter.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

CLASS D10i. Future Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation:

- Open to riders in grades 4-8.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 9.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

- To be eligible for Class D7, a rider must have had at least one year continuous professional instruction, must demonstrate proficiency at the trot and canter, and be capable of competing on a variety of unfamiliar horses.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 6.
- Riders may not cross-enter into Class D8 Walk/Trot.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

CLASS D10T. Future Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation:

- Open to riders in grades 4-8.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 9.

To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

CLASS D12T. Future Novice Dressage Seat Equitation:

- Open to riders in grades 4-8 who meet the criteria for dressage Class D6- Junior Varsity Novice DSE.
- Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter, and halt in a group class.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1 - 7.

CLASS D13T. Future Beginner Dressage Seat Equitation - Walk/Trot/Canter:

- Open to riders in grades 4-8 who meet the eligibility requirements of dressage Class D7- Junior Varsity Beginner DSE - Walk/Trot/Canter.
- Riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Tests 1 - 6.
- Riders may not cross-enter into Class D14 Walk/Trot.
- To be eligible for post-season competition in individual classes riders must have accumulated the required points.

Dressage Seat Equitation Tests

Rule D3304

Riders must be prepared to perform the tests appropriate for the dressage seat equitation class in which they are participating. Riders may be asked to perform the following test collectively or individually during a competition. A dressage judge may choose from the following list, using tests 1 - 5 for the Beginner Walk/Trot classes, 1 - 6 for the Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter classes, 1 - 7 for the Novice classes, 1 - 9 for the Intermediate classes, and 1 - 12 for the Open classes.

Tests 1 - 5 (Beginner Walk/Trot)

1. Ask an appropriate horsemanship question that is tailored to the rider's ability level
2. Halt
3. Transitions using the walk, rising trot, and canter
4. 20m circles
5. Change horses

Tests 1 - 6 (Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter)

6. Figure eight or serpentine at the trot demonstrating changes of diagonal

Tests 1 - 7 (Novice)

7. Figure eight at the canter demonstrating changes of lead through the trot

Tests 1 - 9 (Intermediate)

8. Sitting trot
9. Lengthening at the trot

Tests 1 - 12 (Open)

10. Lengthening at the canter
11. 10m circles at the trot
12. 15m circles at the canter



General Rules

Responsibility:

In exchange for entrance to and participation in the show, this entry constitutes an agreement and affirmation that the team making it, and each of its riders, coaches, trainers, and representatives shall accept and abide by the Rules and Regulations of the IEA and of the Show, and that each rider, coach and Team: (1) is a member in good standing of IEA, (2) is eligible as entered, and (3) will accept as final all rulings of IEA and the show steward (or committee) with respect to their conduct. Also, through participation each rider, rider's parents/legal guardians, coach, trainer, and participant acknowledges THAT HORSES ARE INTRINSICALLY DANGEROUS AND UNPREDICTABLE AND CAN CAUSE SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH, thus each agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless IEA, its officers, directors, members, employees, Executive Director, National Steward, agents and representatives, the Event Host Coordinator, the host team and facility, the show stewards, stewards committee members, the show judges, the show secretary, all show organizers and officials, all medical personnel, and all persons, stables, and others providing facilities, horses or equipment for the Show, other riders, coaches, teams and team sponsoring institutions, from any claim, action or suit, for injury, property damage or death sustained by the individual, rider, entity, coach, trainer, or participant while traveling to, from and around the show, while staying in the city for the show, during participation in the show and while at the show. This entry constitutes an acceptance of the hired officials at this event.

Entries:

Entries will open on **1.19.2024**. All entries will close on **2.05.2024**. Each entry will be charged \$60 per class. Entries received after the closing date are subject to a \$10 per class late fee. The *Individual Dressage Entry Form* is to be used to enter riders that have qualified on an individual basis. {All riders who qualified per class may be entered. The *Team Dressage Entry Form* is to be used to enter only a team, one rider per class.} Scratches can be made with full refund before closing date. After the closing date, entry fees will only be refunded if a substitute team or rider can fill the opening. All payments are to be made by check and must accompany entry form(s).

Checks should be made payable to **IEA DRESSAGE**.

ALL TEAMS ARE REQUIRED TO DONATE PRIZES EQUAL TO THEIR NUMBER OF ENTERED RIDES, AND ALSO SIGN UP FOR VOLUNTEER DUTIES WITH THE SHOW MANAGER BY THE CLOSING DATE. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT CONFIRMATION OF PARTICIPATION.

Dressage Format:

The general format will follow the Rules and Regulations as established by the IEA unless otherwise stated. However, if a topic is not covered by these Rules and Regulations, first the rules and regulations of the Intercollegiate Dressage Association ("IDA") and then, if not resolved the rules of the appropriate national governing body (NGB) may be used as a reference for guidance in making an equitable decision under the circumstances. Any decisions made by a steward or show management shall be final.

All horses will be provided by the host. Horses and Order of Go will be assigned by a random draw on the day of competition. Riders participating in Dressage Test classes will be allowed a minimum of a two (2) minute warm-up prior to the bell, either in the show square, or in a designated warm up area. Show hosts may expand this time as long as each rider is allowed the same amount of time for warm-up. All classes will be judged on equitation, and faults of the horse will not be judged. If a horse should perform so poorly that it is impossible to fairly judge the rider, the judge may request a re-ride. All requests for re-rides will be determined by the steward.

All riders must wear ASTM approved protective headgear whenever mounted.

Dressage Test participants may use a reader during their test during the regular season. Readers are not allowed in post-season competitions.

Dressage Awards:

Champion Dressage Award (D3303): Presented to the high point individual open rider based on the total combined individual class points from the varsity open DSE and varsity open test classes. In case of a tie, the award will be determined by the higher individual test class score. (If the test scores are tied and cannot be broken, refer to Dressage Rule D4600).

Team Championship: Each team will designate one point rider for each class in the Varsity and Junior Varsity and Future divisions. Different riders may be designated for flat and fences. A champion and reserve will be awarded to (1) The High Point Upper School Team and (2) The High Point Futures Team. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st=7 points, 2nd=5 points, 3rd=4 points, 4th=3 points, 5th=2 points, 6th=1 point.

Sportsmanship Award (G4504): The EHC will present a sportsmanship award to a youth member chosen by the show steward. The show steward will select from nominations received throughout the day from any show official or IEA member. The award should be given to the youth member (rider or junior education member) who, during the course of the show and competition, best demonstrated the true meaning of sportsmanship as defined in Rule G1501. The recipient may be a competitor or noncompetitor.

Horse of the Show Award (G4505): The EHC of each regular IEA sanctioned show will award the "Horse of the Show" to be chosen by the judge and/or show steward.
