ELIGIBILITY

- A. Any person 21 years of age or older, and who is considered an amateur under the policies of their disciplines' governing body, may participate in the Adult Pilot Program. Hunt seat will follow the amateur rules of USEF/USHJA, western will follow the amateur rules of AQHA and dressage will follow the amateur rules of USDF.
- B. Participants must be an Adult Member of the IEA and be associated with a registered IEA team prior to participating in Adult Pilot Program competitions.
- C. Participants may not compete in any IEA / Adult Pilot Program show in which they are also the judge, steward or manager of the show in which they intend to compete.

Dressage Discipline: Classes

- <u>AD1. Class 1.</u> Dressage Test Open to all eligible adult members who have had at least one year of continuous professional instruction performing dressage tests. This class shall have two test options to choose from: the *IEA Intermediate Dressage Test* or the *IEA Novice Dressage Test*. Coaches shall choose the test based on the skills of the rider. Regardless of test level performed, the tests will be ranked together based on highest test score(s), unless the class is split in accordance with Rule 4000.J in the *Adult Pilot Program Addendum*. Riders are expected to be proficient in Dressage Rider Tests for DSE classes 1 through 7 (See Rule L in the *Dressage Addendum*). Riders may also participate in Class 2 Dressage Seat Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter.
- <u>AD2. Class 2.</u> Dressage Seat Equitation Walk/Trot/Canter Open to all eligible adult members who have had at least one year of continuous professional instruction and who's coach feels they are capable of cantering on an unfamiliar horse. Riders are expected to be proficient in Dressage Rider Tests for DSE classes 1 through 7 (See Rule L in the *Dressage Addendum*). Riders may also participate in Class 1 Dressage Test, if otherwise eligible.
- <u>AD3. Class 3.</u> Dressage Seat Equitation Walk/Trot Open to all eligible adult members who have had at least six months of continuous professional instruction and who's coach feels they are capable of cantering on an unfamiliar horse but are not yet ready to compete at the canter. Riders are expected to be proficient in Dressage Rider Tests for DSE classes 1 through 5 (See Rule L in the *Dressage Addendum*). Riders may not cross enter in Class 1 or 2 at the same show.

Adult Hunt Seat Descriptions

ELIGIBILITY

- A. Any person 21 years of age or older, and who is considered an amateur under the policies of their disciplines' governing body, may participate in the Adult Pilot Program. Hunt seat will follow the amateur rules of USEF/USHJA, western will follow the amateur rules of AQHA and dressage will follow the amateur rules of USDF.
- B. Participants must be an Adult Member of the IEA and be associated with a registered IEA team prior to participating in Adult Pilot Program competitions.
- C. Participants may not compete in any IEA / Adult Pilot Program show in which they are also the judge, steward or manager of the show in which they intend to compete.

Hunt Seat Discipline: Classes

- <u>AH1. Class 1</u>. Equitation Over Fences Open to all eligible adult members who have had at least one year of continuous professional instruction over fences. This class will have two options to choose from for the height of the fences: 18" cross-rails or 2' verticals. Riders and coaches should choose the height of the fence based on the skills of the rider. The class will be judged together as one class at two fence heights over the same course/track unless it is split in accordance with Rule 4000.K in the *Adult Pilot Program Addendum*. Riders are expected to be proficient in Hunt Seat Rider Tests 1 through 10 (See rule 3304). Riders may also participate in Class 2 Equitation on the Flat Walk/Trot/Canter.
- AH2. Class 2. Equitation on the Flat Walk/Trot/Canter Open to all eligible adult members who have had at least one year of continuous professional instruction and who's coach feels they are capable of cantering on an unfamiliar horse. Riders are expected to be proficient in Hunt Seat Rider Tests 1 through 7 (See rule 3304). Riders in this class may also participate in Class 1 Equitation Over Fences, if otherwise eligible.
- <u>AH3. Class 3</u>. Equitation on the Flat Walk/Trot Open to all eligible adult members who have had at least six months of continuous professional instruction and who's coach feels they are capable of cantering on an unfamiliar horse, but are not yet ready to compete at the canter. Riders are expected to be proficient in Hunt Seat Rider Tests 1 through 5 (See rule 3304). Riders may not cross enter in Class 1 or 2 at the same show.

<u>Dressage Seat Equitation Tests</u> Rule D3304

Riders must be prepared to perform the tests appropriate for the dressage seat equitation class in which they are participating. Riders may be asked to perform the following test collectively or individually during a competition. A dressage judge may choose from the following list, using tests 1 - 5 for the Beginner Walk/Trot classes, 1 - 6 for the Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter classes, 1 - 7 for the Novice classes, 1 - 9 for the Intermediate classes, and 1 - 12 for the Open classes.

Tests 1 - 5 (Beginner Walk/Trot)

- 1. Ask an appropriate horsemanship question that is tailored to the rider's ability level
- 2 Halt
- 3. Transitions using the walk, rising trot, and canter
- 4. 20m circles
- 5. Change horses

Tests 1 - 6 (Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter)

6. Figure eight or serpentine at the trot demonstrating changes of diagonal

Tests 1 - 7 (Novice)

7. Figure eight at the canter demonstrating changes of lead through the trot

Tests 1 - 9 (Intermediate)

- 8. Sitting trot
- 9. Lengthening at the trot

Tests 1 - 12 (Open)

- 10. Lengthening at the canter
- 11. 10m circles at the trot
- 12. 15m circles at the canter

Hunt Seat Tests - Rule H3304

A rider must be prepared to perform the test appropriate for the class in which the rider is participating. Riders may be asked to perform the following tests collectively or individually during a show or competition. A hunt seat judge may choose from the following tests using test 1 - 5 for beginner walk/trot riders, 1 - 7 for beginner walk/trot/canter riders, tests 1 - 10 for novice riders, tests 1 - 13 for intermediate riders, and tests 1 - 16 for open riders. Instructions for performance of the test must be publicly announced. Any one or combination of appropriate or equivalent tests may be used.

Tests 1 - 5 (Beginner Walk/Trot)

- 1. Asked an appropriate horsemanship question that is tailored to the rider's ability level
- 2. Halt
- 3. Sitting trot
- 4. Two point position at the walk and/or trot
- 5. Figure eight at trot, demonstrating change of diagonals

Tests 1 - 7 (Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter)

- 6. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead
- 7. Change horses (additional warm-up jumps will be at the judge's discretion)

Tests 1 - 10 (Novice)

- 8. Ride without stirrups at the trot
- 9. Jump a shortened course
- 10. Trot a jump

Tests 1 - 13 (Intermediate)

- 11. Ride without stirrups at the canter
- 12. Change leads on a straight line, demonstrating simple change of lead
- 13. Half-turn on forehand and/or half-turn on haunches

Tests 1 - 16 (Open)

- 14. Canter on the counter lead
- 15. Hand gallop
- 16. Jump without stirrups

Jumping tests should only be used in over fences classes. When riders are asked to switch horses, additional warm-up jumps will be at the judge's discretion.

Also, through participation each rider, rider's parents/legal guardians, coach, trainer, and participant acknowledges THAT HORSES ARE INTRINSICALLY DANGEROUS AND UNPREDICTABLE AND CAN CAUSE SERIOUS INJURY OR DEATH, thus each agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless IEA, its officers, directors, members, employees, Executive Director, National Steward, agents and representatives, the Event Host Coordinator, the host team and facility, the show stewards, stewards committee members, the show judges, the show secretary, all show organizers and officials, all medical personnel, and all persons, stables, and others providing facilities, horses or equipment for the Show, other riders, coaches, teams and team sponsoring institutions, from any claim, action or suit, for injury, property damage or death sustained by the individual, rider, entity, coach, trainer, or participant while traveling to, from and around the show, while staying in the city for the show, during participation in the show and while at the show. This entry constitutes an acceptance of the hired officials at this event.

Entries:

G4105 In zones that ARE split into regions, the EHC must guarantee at least one entry per class to every team within their region entering before the priority entry closing date. (See Rule G5313) In zones that are NOT split into regions, the EHC must be prepared to accommodate at least twelve (12) riders in each class offered.

G4105.1 Once a team has fulfilled its hosting obligation to the region per Rule G4105, the coach may consult with the zone administrator to approve additional shows limiting entries in any fair and equitable manner. The zone administrator may also grant additional and priority entries to riders from the host team. The total number of rides from the host team may not exceed 50% of the total number of rides entered in the show.

A team roster showing proof of rider eligibility must be included with the entry form per Rule G5311.

Entries will be accepted on a first received basis with full payment until all spots are filled and may be limited in any fair way. Once the closing date has past, additional entries may not be accepted or added.

Each individual will be charged \$45 per DSE class and \$50 per Test Class. One rider in each class should be marked as the priority entry. Scratches can be made with full refund before closing date. After the closing date, entry fees will only be refunded if a substitute team or rider can fill the opening.

The region priority entry period ends with the opening of general entries to other regions and/or zones. Entries from teams within the priority region received after the opening of the general period will be handled as general entries.

Riders who become eligible after the closing date may not enter, even as a substitute.

Dressage Format:

The general format will follow the Rules and Regulations as established by the IEA unless otherwise stated. However, if a topic is not covered by these Rules and Regulations, first the rules and regulations of the Intercollegiate Dressage Association ("IDA") and then, if not resolved the rules of the appropriate national governing body (NGB) may be used as a reference for guidance in making an equitable decision under the circumstances. Any decisions made by a steward or show management shall be final.

All horses will be provided by the host. Horses and Order of Go will be assigned by a random draw on the day of competition. Riders participating in Dressage Test classes will be allowed a minimum of a two (2) minute warm-up prior to the bell, either in the show square, or in a designated warm up area. Show hosts may expand this time as long as each rider is allowed the same amount of time for warm-up. All classes will be judged on equitation, and faults of the horse will not be judged. If a horse should perform so poorly that it is impossible to fairly judge the rider, the judge may request a re-ride. All requests for re-rides will be determined by the steward.

-All riders must wear ASTM approved protective headgear whenever mounted.

Dressage Awards:

Horse of the Show Award (G4505): The EHC of each regular IEA sanctioned show will award the "Horse of the Show" to be chosen by the judge and/or show steward. The award should be given to the horse, regardless of points earned during the course of competition, who best demonstrated fair and generous treatment toward its riders.
